Shaili Chopra, the host for the evening, invited youth climate ambassadors Riddhima Pandey and Aditya Mukarji for a short, animated discussion on climate change. Addressing the audience, Pandey said, "After the 2013 Uttarakhand floods, I thought what if I had been there and lost my home and parents. After that, I filed a petition asking NGT to give directions to our government as they are not fulfilling the conditions of the Paris Agreement.'

Mukarii shared. "This movement has only been made possible because of the youth who are demanding their right to live since our future is at risk.

Mashelkar, in tune with young climate activists, said that there is no denying we are coming to a tipping point, "The scientists are saying it and they go by data, not by perception.


